## 102.1 GRADING POLICY

### GRADING POLICY

1. The Board directs that the instructional program of this District include a system of grading for all pupils which is consistent with the educational goals of the District. The Superintendent shall develop procedures for grading which include the following:
  - A. Each Student should know what end results and achievements are expected at the outset of any course of study.
  - B. Each student should be kept informed of his/her personal progress during the course of a unit of study.
  - C. Methods of grading shall be an appropriate to the course of study and the maturity of the students.
  - D. Teachers shall give mid-term and final exams in grades six through twelve.
  - E. Grading should objectively evaluate and reward students for their efforts.
  - F. Students should be encouraged to evaluate their own achievements.
  - G. All grading systems are subject to continual review and revision.
  - H. Staff, students and parents should be involved in the continuing program of grading review.
  
2. The grading system at Turkeyfoot Area Schools is very simple. It consists of letter or percentage grades which will be given by the teacher to a student at the end of each grading period.
  - A = 100% - 90% = Advanced
  - B = 89% - 80% = Advanced/Proficient
  - C = 79% - 70% = Proficient
  - D\*= 69% - 60% = Basic
  - E = 59% - 0% = Below Basic
  
3. Exception – Approved subjects either Pass or Fail.
  
4. Honor roll is based on percentages.

5. The honor roll will consist of students whose average is 80% to 100% for the nine weeks. Highest honor is accorded to those with all A's; high honor to those with a 90% or higher average; and honor to those with an 80% to 89.99% average.

The SCTC honor roll is to be calculated by the SCTC.

Any grade below a 70% in any subject disqualifies a student for honor roll consideration; and an incomplete grade in any subject delays a student's eligibility until the grade is made up.

A list of students on the honor roll will be posted at the end of each nine week period.

All incomplete grades must be made up before credit will be given for the course.
